With so many WRs and TEs out, other guys are getting opportunities: Ladd "Mad Honkey" McConkey, Adonai Mitchell, and others. That's great for developing depth for this season, and developing players for the next few years. Bowers probably would have been in the game plan anyhow, but having Washington out has put him in the spotlight, and he's delivered.

I think we got the best outing to date from the OL, aside from one sack. The backs ran well and got involved in the passing game. I think that the offense is shaping up well as the SEC season gets underway. And the defense is living up to its reputation as the fastest and most dynamic unit in the country.

Is South Carolina a good measuring stick for this season's team? Probably not, and Vandy won't be either. Things get tougher after that. But for now, call me a happy fan of the team. The Lamestream Sports Media felt that the game boiled down to two key issues. One was putting Bennett in for an early series, a move that flopped without really hurting, but I guess they need to write about something. The other was the presence in the stands of Arch Manning, a high school junior whose attendance dwarfed what was going on between the hedges, apparently. I'm more concerned with the team we've already got. And I like what I see.

Shedrick Wynn provides us all with a lesson in persistence and determination. Once a Jim Donnan recruit in the late 1990s at the defensive end position, he finally walked across the stage in 2020 to become the first person in his family to earn a college degree. He said, "Perseverance and not worrying about what people think was a big part of it. I had a chance, an opportunity in life and the way we were taught when I was young was that you finish what you start. Not having my degree had been eating away at me. There were personal, financial, and other issues that slowed me down at times, but I never tried to get discouraged from my mission. I had to become a caretaker for my wife when she was diagnosed with multiple sclerosis in 2013. This has taught me to believe in yourself until the end. I finally feel some validation of all of the hard work over the years." Shedrick's UGA career was cut short by injuries during his senior year in 2003. Just 12 hours short of his degree, he returned to Lincoln County and married his sweetheart Andrea, with whom he's raised two sons and a daughter, all current or former students at Cedar Shoals HS in Athens, where Shedrick also coached football. His oldest son, Jalen Jackson, now plays football for Georgia Southern. While at Cedar Shoals, Shedrick began talking with Glada Horvat of the compliance department, a Cedar Shoals booster who encouraged him to re-enroll in his late 30s to complete his undergraduate degree in Housing Management and Policy. It took him a while, but completing his degree two decades after starting is a rare and impressive feat, one for which he has earned my admiration. There's an online interview with him about his journey if you want to hear the man tell his story himself. You won't find a more inspiring narrative, or a better man.
