In the wake of their latest loss to Georgia, the University of Florida, following the lead of Facebook, is planning to rebrand itself. In the interminable buildup to the game, I kept reading about Florida's quarterback situation. I was pretty sure, like everyone else, that Anthony Richardson would start. I felt that the key to the game was pressure. Every time he was pressured in his breakout game against LSU, he made bad decisions (2 picks under pressure). Keep the pressure on, I thought, and he'd make a mistake.

Coach Smart's emotional response belied his analytic response, of course: "We had a back go the wrong way, we had a guy read the wrong wristband, we had a guy not block the end, we had a guy jump offsides. We had busts on defense, too. We're just able to overcome some of that now on defense with talent and size and speed. Turnovers, it's like we were 68th in the country and that offends our guys. We gave up 194 passing yards, 161 rushing yards. That's not elite. That's not our standard."

Well, at least it beat Mullen and his much-repeated <u>Gator Standard</u>. But hey, Florida outgained Georgia 355-354. I guess that means Mullen was the game's best coach.

Everyone made much out of the Dawgs' advantage in talent after the game, and Coach Smart made his players the center of attention in the aftermath. But these cats are well-coached as hell and play as a team. I've never seen a unit pursue the ball the way these guys do. All that talent helps. But they are always in the right place, doing the right thing, tackling with precision, and playing as a unit. What a joy to behold.
